


## Why is aviation so important



#### A difficult balance!

- A 10% increase of air connectivity stimulates the GDP growth rate by 1%.
- 1 Euro value in the air transport sector creates 3
  Euro for the overall economy.
- 1 job in the air transport industry creates more than 3 jobs in other sectors.
- The overall economic impact of the aviation sector is estimated at €510bn



- Effects of air pollution are most pronounced in the vicinity of airports and can have a significant effect on human health.
- forecasts of growth in air traffic may lead to an increase in populations affected by aircraft noise!


